





September 2020 Housing Report

HOUSING DEMAND ROSE BY A THIRD IN SEPTEMBER TO HIGHEST LEVEL FOR 16 YEARS

Key Findings

- The number of prospective buyers reached the highest level recorded since June 2004
- An average of 14 sales were agreed per branch, the highest figure recorded since August 2006
- The number of sales to first-time buyers (FTBs) fell to 19 per cent, the lowest recorded in seven years


DEMAND FROM HOUSE HUNTERS

There were **525** house hunters registered per branch in **September**



The number of house hunters registered per estate agent branch rose by a third (33 per cent) from 396 in August, to 525 in September. This is the highest number of house hunters recorded since June 2004, when 581 were recorded per branch.

SALES AGREED

There were **14** sales agreed per branch in **September**



The average number of sales agreed per estate agent branch stood at 14 in September, the highest figure recorded since August 2006. This is an increase from 12 sales agreed per branch in August.

Year-on-year, the number of sales agreed per branch has increased by 75 per cent, rising from eight in September 2019.

The number of sales made to FTBs stood at 19 per cent, falling from 23 per cent in August. This is the lowest amount recorded since March 2013, when the figure also stood at 19 per cent.

WHAT PROPERTIES SOLD FOR

Eight per cent of properties sold for more than the asking price in **September**



In September, eight per cent of properties sold for more than the original asking price, a fall from the high of 13 per cent in August.

The majority (53 per cent) of properties sold for less than the original asking price in September.



HOUSES AVAILABLE TO BUY

There were **41** houses available to buy per member branch in **September**



The number of properties available per member branch stood at 41 in September, rising marginally from 40 in August. Year-on-year, the supply of housing also increased slightly from 40 properties available per member branch in September 2019.




Figure 2: Number of properties available per branch
