





April 2019 Housing Report

NUMBER OF PROPERTY TRANSACTIONS INCREASES DESPITE FALL IN SUPPLY AND DEMAND

Key Findings

- The number of sales agreed per branch increased for the first time this year
- Demand from prospective buyers and supply of properties fell
- · Sales to fist-time buyers (FTBs) increased
- More than four in five properties sold for less than the original asking price

SALES AGREED

There were **eight** sales were agreed per branch in **April**




The number of sales agreed increased for the first time this year, to an average of eight per branch in April. This is the highest level seen since October 2018, when the same number of sales were recorded per branch. Year-on-year, the number of property transactions remains the same.

The number of sales made to FTBs in April increased marginally, rising from 26 per cent in March, to 27 per cent. Year-on-year, this is an increase of three percentage points from 24 per cent.

HOUSES AVAILABLE TO BUY

There were **35** houses available to buy per member branch in **April**



The number of properties available per member branch fell in April, from 37 in March, to 35. Year-on-year housing supply has increased, with only 33 properties available to buy in April 2018.




Figure 2: Number of properties available per branch



DEMAND FROM HOUSE HUNTERS


There were **265** house hunters registered per branch in **April**



After a rise in demand in March, the number of house hunters registered per estate agent branch fell by 10 per cent in April, from 296 to 265.

Year-on-year, demand was at the lowest level recorded for the month of April since 2008, when 237 prospective buyers were registered on average per branch. Housing demand also fell by a fifth (21 per cent) from April 2018 when there were 337 house hunters per branch.

WHAT PROPERTIES SOLD FOR

83 per cent of properties sold for less than the asking price in **April**



In April, more than four in five (83 per cent) properties sold for less than the original asking price and five per cent sold for more.
